


V Form






VI Form

Princeton's Model Congress is a four day program enjoyed by several SAS students each year who want to have more complete and working understanding of the U.S. Congress. The students must have taken or currently take Advanced American History in order to attend Model Congress. Each student chooses a committee in either the House or Senate and writes a bill concerning an issue they feel is pressing and which falls under their committee's jurisdiction. Through small committee sessions of discussion the bill is either passed or failed. If a bill is passed through committee and later through both full House and Senate, it becomes a Model Congress Law. All such laws are then sent to our U.S. Congress as bills for consideration. Princeton's Model Congress gives students the opportunity to extend their ideas and opinions outside of our SAS community and to pool together with others across the country. It also serves as a practice ground for those who may someday be our country's upcoming legislators.






Community Service






















Make Pain Your Ally Cross-Country




It Was Rough Football




Pass, Set, Crush!!! Volleyball

Volleyball will be the fall sport to watch for next year. With four returning starting players and a huge JV team ready to prove their Volleyball worth on a Varsity spot.













Indoor Soccer




WEEKEND










Semi-Formal



















Fall Sports

































A Winning Season In Only Our 2nd Year Swimming And Diving




























Still Rockin' In The House That Bull Built Wrestling

















Takedown, Breakdown, Control, Pin!






A Season On The Edge Men's Lacrosse














Give Me A Lever & I Will Move The World Women's Varsity Crew




SEEK SUFFERING AND IT SHALL LOSE ITS TERROR




Boy's Tennis




