#### Missing Class on Move-In Days

Our teachers are planning around upcoming move-in days and understand that students may not be in class during travel or move-in days. (Students are also welcome to remind their teachers that they will not be in class as the time nears.)

On move-in days, teachers will:

- · Hold class with whomever is able to attend.
- Adjust syllabi accordingly—teachers will use the class period for review, for small group or individual meetings, or for asynchronous work.
- Either not assign homework, or the homework assignment will be to complete the class work for that day.

#### Testing Updates

#### Clarification on Arrival COVID-19 Testing

All students will be tested for COVID-19 as part of the move-in day check-in process. As noted in <u>last week's Monday News</u>, all students and parents will be screened for temperature and symptoms upon arrival at the Welcome Center on the Main Drive. Students who do not display a fever will be tested for COVID-19 at the check-in testing station in the

Field House. Students with a temperature of 100 degrees F will be tested for COVID-19 at the Health Center (NOT at the check-in testing station). We expect to receive results of all arrival tests within 72 hours of testing.

## **Recent Testing Results**

- · All VI Form arrival tests returned negative.
- · All faculty and staff pre-arrival tests returned negative.
- A non-St. Andrew's employee who works with our dining services contractor tested
  positive for COVID-19. The employee is asymptomatic and will be home until approved
  for return to his place of employment in accordance with public health protocols. You

# **Ongoing/Upcoming Campus Testing**

- The second round of on-campus testing for VI Form students took place this week, on Wednesday, September 16 and Thursday, September 17. All girls results have returned negative. We are still awaiting boys' results.
- III Form students will be tested upon arrival on Wednesday, September 23 and Thursday, September 24.
- All faculty and staff will undergo regular (weekly, biweekly, or monthly) COVID-19

# It All Begins in the Classroom...

Ms. Pressman and her AS History: American Social Reform Movements students gather for class under one of our new outdoor classroom tents. Ms. Pressman (along with most other teachers pictured below) is simultaneously teaching the students here  $\it and$  remote students over Zoom.









Ms. Ferguson's Advanced Tutorial: Greek & Latin students gathered in one of our new outdoor classrooms to read and discuss Ab Urbe Condita ("From the Founding of the City") by Livy; the text canvasses all of Roman history from before the founding of Rome to the time of Livy's authorship in the late first century BCE.









French 4 students spent their first class of the year discussing their goals for the course. "Then we moved into a great discussion of our first class text, *Le Casque mystérieux*," says teacher Mr. Westman.









English 4 students in Mr. Porter's class discuss "The Dirty Kid," the first story in Mariana Enriquez's collection *Things We Lost in the Fire*. "It is a story about social responsibility," Mr. Porter says. "The narrator, a well-to-do woman in a poor neighborhood of Buenos Aires, encounters a horror that is 'unthinkable and plausible at the same time."










Multivariable Calculus students work on a static force equilibrium problem with Mr. Kemer. "The problem is, 'For a body of given weight and two upward support tension forces of given magnitudes, in what directions must these tensions be applied to support weight?' It's a problem that is seldom addressed in introductory college physics textbooks because while it is easy to model using simultaneous equations, it is very difficult to solve analytically," explains Mr. Kemer.







V Form students in Mr. Myers' Precalculus class were happy to spend a class period discussing the terminology used to define functions.



Chemistry teacher Mr. Daly has made a tradition out of blowing up eggs on the first day of class in order to demonstrate various safety precautions as well as basic principles of chemistry. Thank goodness for the Front Lawn—St. Andrew's living room.












