#### Does Your Child Need a Second Dose of the COVID-19 Vaccine?

If your child received a first dose of the Pfizer COVID-19 vaccine at our May 19 on-campus clinic, **they will be due for their second dose of the Pfizer vaccine on or after next Wednesday, June 9**. The CDC recommends the second dose of Pfizer be given no later than 42 days after the first dose was administered, which means your child should receive their second dose no later than June 30.

#### A Few Important Points to Remember...

... for tomorrow's move-out process:

- Student rooms must be cleaned out entirely prior to departure. Surfaces should be wiped down, the floor should be swept or vacuumed, and no trash should be left in receptacles. (There has been time set aside for packing and cleaning during this past week.)
- Silver Lake Road remains closed for construction on the bridge. If you are on driving to campus, you will be required to take a significant detour to get to

Noxontown Road. This detour, as well as traffic in Middletown, may add 10-15 minutes to your travel time.
